

Designing for Clarity in Slides

A practical checklist for refining dense presentations into clear, brand-aligned communication.

1 Message & Narrative

- Can the core idea be understood at a glance?
- Does each slide communicate one clear takeaway?
- Is there a clear story connecting each slide?



Clear ideas lead the design.

2 Structure & Hierarchy

- Does hierarchy guide attention to what matters most?
- Are headlines doing real work, or just labeling sections?
- Is supporting content clearly secondary to the main point?



What matters most stands out.

3 Data & Visual Clarity

- Are charts and graphics simplified without losing accuracy?
- Can the audience take in the slide comfortably?
- Do visuals help explain the insight, or just display information?



Insight conveys information.

4 Brand & Consistency

- Are typography, spacing, and color consistent across slides?
- Does the brand system stay consistent while letting the content lead?
- Could another teammate continue the deck without reinventing the layout?



Brand is consistent and unobtrusive.

5 Pace & Cognitive Load

- Can the slide be scanned in a few seconds?
- Is unnecessary content crowding the message?
- Does the layout reduce visual clutter and support the message?



Easy to read, not crowded.
